PROCLAMATION Proclaiming the Month of April Child Abuse Awareness & Prevention Month

Whereas, children are vital to our community's future success, prosperity, and quality of life as well as being our most valuable assets:

Whereas, nearly 60,000 children receive services from a Children's Advocacy Center in Texas annually:

Whereas, child abuse prevention is a community responsibility and finding solutions depends on involvement among all people;

VIII. City Manager's Briefing

City Manager J.J. Oznick briefly covered the report that the commissioners have in their packet. He stated that EHT began surveying both forks of the Leon River and Weaver Creek in preparation for the GLO H&H study.

WWTP Improvements

The Texas Hwy 6 South Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project is in progress and should be completed in a couple of months.

TXDOT Exit 343 Ramp and Signal Light Projects

Texas Department of Transportation is still projecting to have the new traffic lights installed at the intersection of E. Main and the Service Roads between October and December 2022.

IX. Code Enforcement Report

Planning and Zoning Director Tony Stubblefield reported the Code Compliance Report for February 2022. There were 10 open cases at the beginning of the month, 28 new cases were opened and 23 cases were closed which ended the month with 15 cases open. 2 citations were issued and two cases were reported for back taxes. 3 annual notices were sent with fines assessed at \$1,149.

X. Police Report

City Manager Oznick stated the Report is in the packets. Police Personnel were unavailable to be here tonight.

XI. Fire Chief Report

(This was given before Agenda Item 3, Executive Session, in order to let the Fire personnel get back to work). Fire Chief Joe Williamson gave the following activity report for the month of February for the Volunteer and Paid Firefighters. Total call volume: 85 which was an average of 3.03 calls per day. 60 of these were in the City Limits and 18 of them were in the county and they responded to 7 calls for mutual aid to other county fire departments.

There were 11 incidents between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. There was 1 structure fire, 8 grass fires and 1 vehicle fire. They responded to 24 Medical calls, 20 Motor Vehicle accidents and 8

Public Service assists and 22 false alarms/investigations. They installed 1 Smoke Detector and added one new Volunteer Fire Fighter. Chief Williamson also gave a brief summary of the Response to the "Eastland Complex" fires. He will give a complete report, along with a power point presentation, at the April Commission meeting. Chief Williamson and the firemen were given a standing ovation by the Commissioners and the audience.
